### Our Speakers

**Rev. John Hill** received his B.A. from Concordia University, Ann Arbor, in 1986. He graduated from Concordia Theological Seminary (CTS), Fort Wayne, Indiana, in 1990 and was called to serve Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Forbes, North Dakota. Since 1996 he has served as pastor of Mount Hope Lutheran Church and School in Casper, Wyoming. He earned the S.T.M from CTS in 2009. Pastor Hill serves as the Education Executive and 1st Vice President of the Wyoming District. Pastor and Angela Hill married in 1992 and have five children: Andrew, Christina (and Nickolas) Lewallen, Marie, Catherine, and Michael.

**Rev. Jordan McKinley** serves as pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Bennett, IA, and St. Paul Lutheran Church in Stanwood, IA, so he's never confused as to where he is supposed to be.
